This waiver must be presented before receiving a lift pass. NO EXCEPTIONS-MANDATORY. Athlete waivers will be done during online ticket purchase.

Lodging and Transportation – Race participants must arrange their own lodging and transportation to the venues.

Merchandise – All pre-ordered merchandise will be handed out at the time of school check-in. There will be limited quantities for sale during check-in at Ashland Hills and Mt. Ashland lodge.

Important!! Spectator information -

- All spectators, including those needing to walk to the venue, will need to purchase lift tickets through Mt Ashland.
- Uphill travel to the venues will be limited and has the potential to change at any time based on the needs of mountain operations, ski patrol and conditions beyond our control.
- Foot traffic between the venue bases and lodge will be limited to the following windows: 9:00am-10am, 12:00pm-1:00pm, and 2:00pm-4:00pm.
- Foot traffic to and from the venue bases is limited to the marked corridor.
- Please be aware the walk to the race venues is not handicap accessible, plan on at least a 15 minute walk across potentially uneven and slippery conditions. There are no restroom facilities outside of the lodge.
- Caution: There are no bathroom facilities at the race venues. Please note the restricted travel times.

Note: This will be the venue for the officials, coaches & gate judges meeting, off mountain registration and ski tuning room.

COACHES INFORMATION

Note: Be prepared, there will be a short window of time between your last race and these deadlines!

Team Online Registration (Head Coach) – Teams will NOT register online this year. The main purpose was to capture your gate judges. This will now be done via submission of your team start orders. Please be prepared to submit your gate judges when you send in your start orders. Remember you are required to provide gate judge(s) if you have a team (3 or more each gender), one gate judge per gender. You will need to submit a name, email and cell number.

Coaches Lift Passes - Coaches will need to pre-register at the time of submitting your start orders for complimentary lift passes. These lift passes will be good for Wednesday, Thursday & Friday.

Coach complimentary lift passes are issued on a “per school” basis allocated according to the gender and size of the team. A school that only qualifies one racer is still entitled to assign a coach to follow that individual racer. That coach will be issued a comp pass. A school with one girl racer and one boy racer is entitled to assign a separate coach to follow each racer and each of these coaches will be issued a comp pass.

- Each school with 3 or more racers = 2 comp coach passes.
- Each school with a girl’s team, and a boy’s team of 3 or more racers of each gender = 4 comp coach passes.
- Each school with 1 or 2 girl racers = 1 comp coach pass
- Each school with 1 or 2 boy racers = 1 comp coach pass

Note: Coaches lift passes are for coaches only. If you or your coaches have a season pass please do not request lift passes for others.

Liability Waiver – All Coaches must complete a Mt. Ashland “Liability Release,” form. This form must be completed and turned in at the time of the school check-in. Forms available for download at the State Race Website and will be sent to head coaches along with the start order request form.

Team Start Orders – Your submission worksheet will be available for download at the state race website. All Registration Deadlines are Thursday, February 27th at 7 pm, NO EXCEPTIONS.

Start Order Worksheet:

- Worksheets will also be emailed to each coach by the race administrator.
- If you need a Google Excel link instead of an Excel workbook please contact Mike McManus.
- Upon completion, email the official State Start Order workbook form with your team or individual athlete’s order of start and leagues qualifying position.
- Include Gate Judges as needed.
- Include Coaches Pass(s) request.

Onsite Team Registration Check-in – All teams (and individual qualifiers) must check-in upon arrival. Please, only one representative per school! See schedule for times & locations.

At this time you will:

- ✓ Turn in your coaches Mt. Ashland Liability Release Form(s) (MANDATORY)
- ✓ Pick up your coaches lift passes (pass will not be distributed without signed release forms from all coaches.
- ✓ Submit your gate judge deposit. (Note: Gate Judge Deposits must be secured with a check made payable to: **SOSEF**)
- ✓ Collect all pre-ordered Merchandise for your team
- ✓ Pickup racer Swag gifts

Note: The Gate Judges deposit is \$150 per race (SL or GS), per sex. This would be a total of \$600 for a school with both a boys and a girl's team. This check will be destroyed at the conclusion of the Championships Race if duty is fulfilled (unless specified otherwise.)

Note: Bibs will be distributed to the team (or individual racers) coach at the coaches meeting on Wednesday night. Racers will use the same bib number both days. If a racer is only racing one of the two days he/she will receive a bib assignment for that single day. Racers keep their bibs at the conclusion of the race.

On-Hill Training – Wednesday, March 5th is the registered training day. Training lane assignments are TBD.

Training Notes –

- Teams must provide their own gates.
- A coach or parent representative must be at the top of the course at all times.
- Courses must be pulled and slipped by the time indicated on the schedule.
- Helmets are mandatory for GS & SL training and racing (hard cover over ears and FIS certification required for GS).

Racer Social Chaperone – Each school must provide a chaperone to be onsite and available for the racer social.

Merchandise & Awards Meal Tickets - Coaches may purchase Race Merchandise and/or Awards night meal ticket (\$20) at the ACTIVE link provided here: [Link Here](#) (Link at state website too.)

- You will only be able to order during the active registration period February 25th thru 27th.
- Some merchandise will be available for sale at registration
- Dinner Tickets must be pre-ordered.

ATHLETE INFORMATION

Racer Online Registration – Racers will register online with the same site that they used to register for the regular season. Registration will open Tuesday, February 25th at 9 am. The registration deadline is Thursday, February 27th at 7 pm. No Exceptions.

Athlete registration fees for 2025 will be **\$30**

During the registration process you will also have the opportunity to order some optional items:

- Dinner meal voucher (\$20) for after the race on Friday *

You must pre-order during athlete registration.

Lift Passes – Mt. Ashland will provide a 3 day lift pass for \$150. To purchase your lift pass please see this link: mtashland.com/OISRASStateRace (Line may not be available at the time of this publication.) Racers may purchase single day passes onsite for \$50.

Schedule of Events – Please familiarize yourself with the Schedule of Events located in this Event Handbook.

Racer Notes – Please be courteous and respectful to other athletes, volunteers, coaches, the public, and **Mt. Ashland** employees. Show your appreciation for all their hard work.

Familiarize yourself with the Mt Ashland train map prior to skiing. Remember that all athletes must adhere to the *Skier's Responsibility Code - Are You Aware.*

- Do not leave skis in non-designated areas outside of lodge. Mt. Ashland and the event organizers are not responsible for theft or vandalism of your equipment.
- Lift tickets or passes are required for all lifts at all times (training and racing).
- Helmets meeting FIS Specifications (see Alpine Race Rules, Section 2, Paragraph A., 5., f.) are required for all training and racing.
- NO FAST SKIING IN SLOW AREAS! This will result in loss of lift privileges.
- Bags and equipment must be kept out of walkway and off tables.

Racers Bibs – Bibs will be distributed to the team (or individual racers) coach at the coaches meeting on Wednesday night. Racers will use the same bib number both days. If a racer is only racing one of the two days he/she will receive a bib assignment for that day.

Your racer bib is considered a part of your race gear. Please remember to bring your bib to the race each day.

After the race has concluded you are free to keep your bib as a souvenir of your season's accomplishment!

INFORMATION FOR OFFICIALS & VOLUNTEERS

Liability Waiver – All Volunteers must complete a Mt. Ashland “Liability Release,” form to receive your lift pass for that day. Forms available for download at the State Race Website. To expedite your check-in, it is recommended that you download, sign and bring to the check-in desk. We will also have forms available onsite during check-in but this will cause delay.

Mandatory Gate Judge Meeting –

Wednesday: March 5th at 7:00 pm, Ashland Hills Hotel - COSMOS Room 2

All Gate Judges regardless of which day you are working are required to attend this Wednesday night meeting.

At the gate judge meeting, gate judging responsibilities will be reviewed along with specific instructions related to this race. There will not be time to do this on the race mornings, so attendance at this meeting is mandatory.

Lift Pass - Race officials and volunteers will be issued lift pass for that race day at volunteer check-in prior to the race. (Note: must have signed mountain waiver.)

Race Volunteer Race Day Check-in – Check-in for officials, forerunners, gate judges, and other race workers, is at Race HQ at [Mt. Ashland](#) Lodge, 1nd Floor. Please see the Race Day Schedule for your check-in time. We have approximately 100 volunteers each day and your adherence to the schedule would be greatly appreciated! You will be issued a lift pass, lunch and appropriate equipment for your volunteer duty.

Hand Timers – Both GS and SL course hand timers must check in at the Timing Booth for the course you are timing at 9:15 am to receive instructions and equipment. Timers will proceed directly to their course positions; timers need to be at their positions 15 minutes before Forerunners are to run. See the race schedule below for times.

Forerunners – Please pick up your lift pass at the volunteer check-in desk. All forerunners should check-in with the Start Referee 60 minutes before the start of the race. The start referee will have your forerunner bib. Forerunner bibs must be returned each day after you have completed your second run forerun.

2025 STATE SOUVENIR CLOTHING

MOUNTAIN INFORMATION

Parking at Mt. Ashland – Mt. Ashland is located within the Rogue River-Siskiyou National Forest. Oregon “**Snow Park Permits**” are required. Annual Sno-Park Permits are \$25, 3-day (consecutive) Permits are \$9, and Daily Permits are \$4 if purchased through the Oregon DMV. Permits may be purchased at Mt. Ashland Ski Resort for \$6 per day.

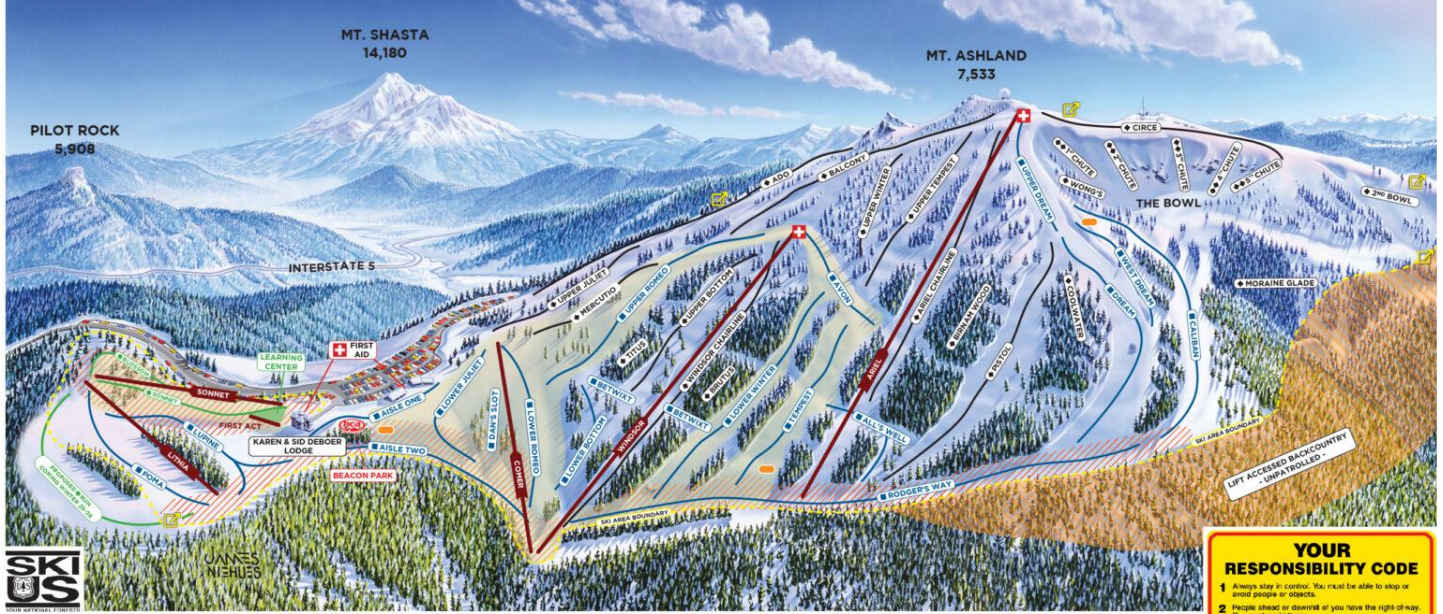
Dogs/Pets

YOUR RESPONSIBILITY CODE

- 1 Always stay in control. You cannot be able to stop or avoid people or objects.
- 2 People ahead or downhill of you have the right-of-way. You must avoid them.
- 3 Stop only where you are visible from above and do not restrict trails.
- 4 Look uphill and avoid others before starting downhill or entering a trail.
- 5 You must prevent runaway equipment.
- 6 Read and obey all signs, warnings and hazard markings.
- 7 Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
- 8 You must know how and be able to trail, rise and avoid lifts safely. If you need assistance, ask the lift attendant.
- 9 Do not use lifts or terrain when impaired by alcohol or drugs.
- 10 If you are involved in a collision or incident, share your contact information with each other and a ski area employee.

Know and Obey the Code. It's Your Responsibility.

If you need help understanding the Code, please see an employee.

Padding, fencing, equipment covers and other marked devices and warnings are in place to inform and to indicate a potential obstacle or hazard. These markers and warnings WILL NOT protect you from injury. It is your responsibility to avoid marked objects and areas. Faster skiing means more risk of injury in collisions.

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Notes

- Per OISRA rules, “racers are to wear their official start number (bib) visible in racing fashion while skiing from the time of distribution to the time of collection, except for starter area.” Racers may keep their bibs following the races on Friday.
- The inspection method will be determined at the coaches meeting or prior to course inspection.
- Alternate Substitution procedures will be addressed at the coaches meeting
- DQ Posting and Protest procedures will be addressed at the coaches meeting
